Ordinance No. 29-2021

Passed June 21st, 2021

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE DATE FOR OBSERVANCE OF JUNE 19th, ALSO KNOWN AS JUNETEENTH, IN 2021 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Federal Government recently passed a law to recognize June 19th, Juneteenth, which marks the end of slavery in the United States, and

WHEREAS, Governor Mike DeWine issued a statement on Thursday June 18th. His Juneteenth statement noting the state's automatic observance of all federal holidays and declared that most government offices would be closed Friday June 19th in observance of the newly created Federal Holiday, and

WHEREAS, both establishments and/or recognition of June 19th, or Juneteenth, came too late for the Village of Brewster to either establish or observe the holiday, but the Village would still like to observe Juneteenth, and it seems appropriate since the new Federal Holiday of Juneteenth has passed to celebrate Juneteenth, which recognizes the end of slavery in the United States, in conjunction Independence Day on July 4th.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BREWSTER, THAT:

SECTION 1: The Village of Brewster shall observe June 19th, or Juneteenth in 2021 on Friday July 2nd in advance of the July 4th weekend and the Village's observance of July 4th on Monday July 5th.


SECTION 2: The above policy replaces any previous version of this policy and supersedes any current policy which may be in conflict with this policy.

SECTION 3: This ordinance is an emergency as the July 4th Holiday occurs prior to the next Meeting of Council scheduled for July 5th/6th and shall be in full force and effect at the earliest date provided by law.




