

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE CURB AND GUTTER AND HANDICAPPED RAMPS PORTION OF THE SEVENTH STREET IMPROVEMENT AND PAVING PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, with the passage of Ordinance 52-2018 on November 19, 2018 Brewster Village Council offered their support of the Fairless Local Schools Safe Routes to Schools Plan, and

WHEREAS, the implementation of this Safe Routes to Schools Plan sets a goal of increasing the ability of children to walk and bike to Fairless Schools, and to make it safer for these students to do so, and

WHEREAS, the overall cost of implementing a Safe Routes to Schools Plans is daunting in scope which encourages the Village and Fairless Schools to complete the project in smaller steps installing and constructing portions as funds are available, and

WHEREAS, the recent advertisement for Bids for the Seventh Street Improvement and Paving Project that was completed in accordance with all applicable laws included the construction of 850 lineal feet of curb and gutter and five handicap ramps on the north side of 7th Street between Park Drive and Amherst, and

WHEREAS, the lowest and best Bidder on the construction and installation of 850 lineal feet of curb and gutter and five handicap ramps was Central Allied Enterprises, Inc. of Canton, Ohio at \$35,700.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BREWSTER, THAT:

SECTION 1: It is determined that Central Allied Enterprises, Inc. of Canton, Ohio was the lowest and best Bidder at \$ 35,700.00 for the construction and installation of 850 lineal feet of curb and gutter and five handicap ramps portion of the Brewster Seventh Street Improvement & Paving Project

SECTION 2: The Village Administrator is authorized to enter into a contract with Central Allied Enterprises, Inc. of Canton, Ohio for the completion of the construction and installation of 850 lineal feet of curb and gutter and five handicap ramps portion of Seventh Street Improvement & Paving Project in accordance with the specifications on which the Bids were received.

SECTION 3: The payment of the amounts due under said contract shall be appropriated from the Street Improvement Fund as well as the Street Resurfacing Fund, if needed.

SECTION 4: This ordinance is an emergency to allow the Village to be prepared for the appropriate construction season and shall be in full force and effect at the earliest date provided by law.
