

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 59-2016 TO ADD AN ANNUAL STIPEND FOR THE VILLAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER AND TO SET THE OBJECTIVES AND THE SOURCE OF THE JOB DESCRIPTION FOR THE POSITION**

WHEREAS, Village Ordinance 59-2016 last modified the compensation and benefits of Village employees, and

WHEREAS, upon the recommendation of the Village Police Chief and the Village Mayor, Brewster Village Council desires to provide a stipend for the Police Department School Resource Officer that is assigned to Fairless Schools, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BREWSTER, THAT:

**SECTION 1:** Village Ordinance 59-2016 Section 7D shall be amended to set an annual stipend of \$ 1000 for the Village Police Department School Resource Officer, and Section 7D shall be reconfigured as shown next:

**D. Annual stipends** provided for other assignments in the Police Department shall be as follows

DARE Officer	= \$ 1000 (\$ 0.48/hour)	(Duties described in Ordinance 50-2000)
K-9 Officer	= \$ 1000 (\$ 0.48/hour)	(Duties described in Ordinance 50-2000)
Lead Investigator	= \$ 1000 (\$ 0.48/hour)	(Duties described in Ordinance 42-2003)
Training Officer	= \$ 1000 (\$ 0.48/hour)	(Duties described in Ordinance 39-1996)
<b>School Resource Officer</b>	<b>= \$ 1000 (\$ 0.48/hour)</b>	

**SECTION 2: Objectives of School Resource Officer Position (SRO):**

School Resource Officers are law enforcement officers whose primary purpose is to "keep the peace" in their schools so that students can learn and teachers can teach. They are law-related counselors who provide guidance on law-related issues to students and act as a link to support services both inside and outside the school environment. They are law-related education teachers who provide schools with an additional educational resource by sharing their expertise in the classroom. Beyond these identified roles and, perhaps most importantly, SROs are positive role models for many students who are not exposed to such role models in today's society. Their presence in the schools sends a strong message that violence is not acceptable

**SECTION 3: Job Description:**

The School Resource Officer duties and qualifications shall be set by the Village Police Chief, and shall be modified as needed by the Village Police Chief as any duty or qualification component may be altered by the needs of the Village Police Department or Fairless Schools, or as modified by the U.S. Department of Education, the U.S. Department of Justice, the Ohio Department of Public Safety, the Ohio Attorney General's Office, the Ohio Department of Education, the Ohio School Resource Officers Association, or other applicable governing body.

**SECTION 4:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect at the earliest date provided by law.
