

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 76 - PARKING REGULATIONS OF THE
VILLAGE CODE OF ORDINANCES WITH THE ADDITION OF SECTION 76.061 –
PARKING ON VILLAGE STREETS, ALLEYS, AND RIGHT OF WAYS**

WHEREAS, Brewster Village Council has received a request to review the parking of vehicles upon Village streets, alleys, and public right-of-ways, and

WHEREAS, after careful review of the issue, Brewster Village Council desires to regulate the parking of vehicles on Village street, alley, or public right-of-ways, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BREWSTER, THAT:

SECTION 1: Brewster Village Council authorizes the amendment of Chapter 76 of the Brewster Code of Ordinances by adding the following:

Section 76.061 - Parking: No person shall park a vehicle upon a public street, alley, or public right-of-way for than more than seventy-two consecutive hours. The following penalties may be levied:

Penalties:

(A) The Police Department shall ticket all violations of Section 76.061. All tickets for violation of parking restrictions shall result in a \$ 20.00 fine per violation. If a ticket issued for a parking violation is not paid within ten days of being issued, on the eleventh day an additional \$ 5.00 will be also added to the total fine.

(B) Any vehicle that is subject to three or more unpaid parking tickets may be towed by or at the direction of the Police Department, either to the police department parking lot or to a commercial tow yard within ten miles of Brewster, and said vehicle shall not be released to its owner until the owner pays the unpaid parking tickets, and any associated costs. The Village and its employees are not liable for any damages to a vehicle that is towed pursuant to this section.

SECTION 2: The above replaces and supersedes any current regulation which may be in conflict with this regulation

SECTION 3: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect at the earliest date provided by law.
