AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 45-2024 ESTABLISHING THE VILLAGE FIRE DEPARTMENT FEE SCHEDULE FOR CHARGED FOR SERVICES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Brewster Village Council provides a part time Village paramedic service and fire services to Village residents and for the contracted areas of Sugarcreek and Tuscarawas Townships; and

WHEREAS, Brewster Village Council has determined that the levying of fees for services provided by the Village Fire Department and the Village Emergency Medical Services is necessary to supplement the cost of these services; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Billing, the billing firm employed by the Village, recommended that charges for services are in need of updating.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BREWSTER, THAT:

SECTION 1: The Billing Agency employed by the Village of Brewster is hereby authorized to soft bill residents with insurance of the Brewster Fire Department Service Area who receive emergency medical and ambulance transport and fire rescue services from the Brewster Fire Department. Uninsured residents of the Brewster Fire Department Service Area that do not have insurance will be billed a flat fee of \$400.00.

Non-Residents of the Brewster Fire Department Service Area who receive emergency medical and ambulance transport and fire rescue services from the Brewster Fire Department will be responsible for the entire bill.

SECTION 2: The resulting fee schedule with the above changes for services and care provided by the Brewster Volunteer Fire Department and Emergency Medical Services listed next is adopted and approved.

A. Charge for Basic Life Support (BLS) and care	= \$ 700.00
B. Charge for BLS Non-Emergency	= \$ 400.00
C. Charge for Advanced Life Support One (ALS1) assessment and the provision of one or more ALS interventions	= \$ 800.00
D. Charge for Advanced Life Support One (ALS1) for Non-Emergency	= \$ 550.00
E. Charge for Advanced Life Support Two (ALS2) which includes the administration of three different medications or the provision of one or more of the following ALS procedures: manual defibrillation/ cardioversion, endotracheal intubation, chest decompression, or intraseous line.	= \$ 900.00
F. Charge for Specialty Care for hospital-to-hospital transport	= \$ 1145.00
G. Emergency Response Call – MVA	= \$ 300.00
H. Charge per loaded mile from the scene to the hospital shall	= \$ 20.00/mile
I. Resident Self-Pay – Uninsured	= \$ 400.00
J. Charge for Extrication when tools are required to remove a trapped victim from the scene and/or Charge for Extrication in a water rescue to remove a trapped victim from a vehicle or buggy.	= \$ 450.00

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K. Charge for a Vehicle Fire	= \$ 450.00
Charge for a Truck Fire	= \$ 600.00
Charge for a Semi Fire	= \$ 1,000.00
M. Charge for Transport to the Morgue	= \$ 75.00
N. Scene Safety	= \$ 250.00
O. Landing Zone	= \$ 250.00
P. Lift Assist	= \$ 200.00

SECTION 3: The following services and fees for replacement/cleaning of any turnout gear or other equipment damaged in an emergency rescue service shall be charged at current market value:

- Coat
- Pants
- Boots (leather)
- Gloves
- Nomex Hood
- Helmet
- Cleaning (per item)
- Oil Dry – per bag
- Foam – per 5 gallons
- Attack Line 1.5 – per 50ft Section
- Attack line 2.5 – per 50ft Section
- HazMat Pillow Kit
- Supply Line – per 1000ft Section
- SCBA – Harness and Electronics Only
- SCBA – Bottle
- SCBA – Mask

SECTION 4: The Village shall contract with a billing agency to collect the above fees. The Fire Chief, the Emergency Medical Services Coordinator, Village Clerk-Treasurer, and the Mayor shall provide administration of the billing process, and in that capacity will use discretion in the pursuit of unpaid bills.


SECTION 5: The funds received pursuant to the fee schedule shall be deposited in the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Fund, and/or the Ambulance Replacement Fund, and/or the Fire Fund in a manner provided by Brewster Village Council who may modify the percentage provided to each Fund from time to time by motion and majority vote.

SECTION 6: This ordinance shall be declared an emergency as the funds received per this ordinance are required for the operation of staffing services for the Brewster Fire Department and the health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the Village of Brewster. This ordinance shall be in effect at the earliest date provided by law.

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
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
