AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ENTERING INTO CONTRACT FOR THE BREWSTER WATER TRANSMISSION MAIN REPLACEMENT PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Brewster Water Transmission Main Replacement Project is needed to make needed water transmission replacements and upgrades of approximately 4540 feet in the Village to improve the transmission grid and to provide more redundancy, including:

- replacing the "transmission line" coming from the plant down 4th Street to Wabash (1940s +/-) with an 8-inch line. The current line is 10-inch from Lincoln to Washington and 4-inch from Washington to Wabash (1690 feet)
- replacing the 6-inch water line on Lincoln from 4th Street to 2nd Street (1960s +/-) with an 8-inch line (775 feet)
- replacing the 6-inch line on 2nd Street from Lincoln to Wabash (1940s +/-) with an 8-inch line (1,700 feet)
- replacing a portion of water line that used to run to the old water tower from 4th Street to 5th Street on Washington (age unknown, but the North Water Tower was built in 1949) - (375 feet), and

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvements described above are a priority for the community because of their age and a recent Water Modeling Report completed by CT Consultants for the Village that identified these water transmission replacements and upgrades as the top priority for the Village's water system, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Brewster submitted an application for the Brewster Water Transmission Main Replacement Project through the OPWC District 19 process, and

WHEREAS, the Brewster Water Transmission Main Replacement Project has been approved for \$1,500,000 of OPWC Funding in the form of a \$1,200,000 Grant and a \$300,000 zero percent (0%) twenty (20) year loan for a project initially estimated at a total cost of \$1,653,917, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Brewster has competitively bid the Brewster Water Transmission Main Replacement Project in accordance with all State of Ohio and Village laws, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Brewster has received and opened bids, and

WHEREAS, based on the bids received, the Village's engineering firm on the project has provided Council with a recommended Contractor for the Brewster Water Transmission Main Replacement Project, who is qualified under OPWC programs, for award of a contract for completion of the project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BREWSTER, THAT:

SECTION 1: It is determined that **Palmer & Son Excavating of Wooster, Ohio** was the lowest and best Bidder for the Brewster Water Transmission Main Replacement Project and therefore awards it a contract in the amount of **\$1,272,685.40**.

SECTION 2: The Village Administrator and Village Clerk-Treasurer are authorized and directed to execute the contract with **Palmer & Son Excavating of Wooster, Ohio** for the completion of the Brewster Water Transmission Main Replacement Project in accordance with the specifications on which the Bids were received. An executed copy of the Contract shall be kept on file in the Village Clerk-Treasurer's Office.

SECTION 3: That the Village Administrator is hereby authorized to employ an engineering firm to perform contract administration and construction oversight and inspection as needed for the Brewster Water Transmission Main Replacement Project.

SECTION 4: That Brewster Village Council does agree to obligate the Village funds to the extent necessary.

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SECTION 4: This ordinance is considered to be an emergency to allow construction to commence at the earliest possible date so that the project can be completed by the completion date and to provide as much favorable weather as possible to do so and shall be in full force and effect at the earliest date provided by law.




