

A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING BIMELER PARK BALLFIELD #1 AS TERRY FOWLER FIELD

WHEREAS, Terry Fowler was an integral part of Village recreation programs for many years through his work with the area Youth Baseball and Softball programs, and

WHEREAS, Terry provided leadership in our community in working with others to provide baseball and softball programs in our area, was an inspiration to the boys and girls of our community as a coach and role model, and through just plain hard work helped build and maintain ball field facilities in the Village, and

WHEREAS, Terry and the many others before him, with him, and after him, too numerous to list herein, gave of themselves through the sweat of their brow and the many hours of their time, to provide ball fields and programs to educate our girls and boys in the games that taught teamwork, right from wrong, and the spirit of fair play that continue to guide them in their lives.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BREWSTER, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1: In recognition of the efforts of Terry Fowler and the many other individuals that were a part of a concerted effort to provide recreational programs to the Brewster community in the past and into the future, Brewster Village Council designates Bimeler Ballfield #1 as Terry Fowler Field.

(Ballfield #1 is adjacent to the Village Police Station on W. First Street in Bimeler Park)

SECTION 2: Village Council respectfully requests that the Fairless Youth Baseball Softball Association recognize the designation of Field #1 as Terry Fowler Field in their activities in Bimeler Park now and into the future.

SECTION 3: The Village Administrator shall cause to be attached to the Field #1 backstop a weather resistant sign that states that the ball field is designated as Terry Fowler Field.

SECTION 4: This Resolution shall take effect at the earliest date provided by law.
